POSITION

The Firefighter position responds to fire alarms, medical emergencies, hazardous materials, urban rescue, and other calls to protect life and property; participates in fire prevention and training; and maintains the fire station and firefighting equipment. ESSENTIAL AND MARGINAL FUNCTIONS

- Respond to fire alarms with an assigned company; lay and connect hose; maintain pumping
 apparatus; hold nozzles and direct water streams; raise and climb ladders; ventilate burning
 structures; enter buildings to evacuate occupants.
- Operate all fire operation and rescue equipment, including portable fire extinguishers, pike
 poles, hand lines, fans, saws, salvage covers, forcible entry tools, and emergency medical
 equipment.
- Respond to emergency medical incidents such as auto accidents, gas system leaks, and animals in distress; analyze patient needs and administer basic emergency medical until relieved by proper medical personnel.
- Preserve evidence at fire scenes.
- Participate in fire station housekeeping and maintenance.
- Perform search and rescue of individuals in hazardous environments, such as collapsed buildings, auto accidents, hazardous material spills, and confined spaces.
- Attend special instruction in firefighting and emergency medical techniques; perform drills
 with other engine company staff; become familiar with district layout, established response
 routes, and hydrated/non-hydrated systems; prepare and maintain a variety of firefighting
 preplan drawings and schematics.
- Provide public information on fire prevention, CPR, and career opportunities.
- Perform related duties and responsibilities as required.

QUALIFICATIONS

Must be current on the Firefighter Candidate Testing Center (FCTC) Statewide Eligibility List (SEL) by the final filing date of 10/27/2024. For more information on how to be placed on the FCTC SEL, visit https://https://www.fctconline.org/becoming-a-firefighter/fctc-statewide-list/. A passing score on the FCTC Written Test and CPAT must be dated between 10/27/23 and 10/27/24. Final filling date for applications 10/27/24.

EXPERIENCE:

 Preferred: Two years as a Volunteer, or at least one season as a Seasonal Firefighter, or six months as a full-time paid firefighter

EDUCATION AND TRAINING:

- Equivalent to graduation from high school. An associate degree or higher in fire science, fire administration, business administration, or a related field is desirable but not required.
- Must meet current physical condition requirements at the appointment date and maintain them as required by standard operating procedures.

LICENSE AND CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Possession of state-accredited Firefighter 1 certification and completion of a stateaccredited Firefighter 1 Academy.
- Possession of current California EMT certification at time of appointment.
- Possession of current California Class C driver's license on the date of application.

 - o S130 Firefighter Training
 - S131 Firefighter Type 1
 - o S190 Introduction to Wildland Fire Behavior
- Possession of National Incident Management System (NIMS) certifications:
 - o ICS 100, ICS 200, IS 700, and IS 800
- Hazardous Materials First Responder Operational (FRO)
- Confined Space Rescue Awareness
- Possession of Firefighter 2, Low Angle Rope Rescue Operations (LARRO), Fire Fighter Survival, Vehicle Extrication, Fire Control 3-Structural Fire Fighting certifications are preferred.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

 Must be at least 18 years of age with a clean criminal background as determined by fingerprinting through the California Department of Justice.

SCHEDULE

48 hours on duty, 96 hours off duty, or a 40-hour work schedule, depending upon roles and responsibilities.

PROBATION

This position is subject to a one-year probationary period.
